Payment methods

2025 Parent contribution payments can be made via the Payment Centre on Compass. Please follow the tile on the portal or app to complete your payment.

It is suggested choosing from the following options:

1. Pay in full at any time, however it would be appreciated if contributions could be completed by 31st January, 2025.
2. Pay via two instalments, \$125 by 31st January, 2025, and \$125 by 31st May, 2025
3. Pay via four instalments, \$70 by 31st January, 2025, \$60 by 31st March, 2025, \$60 by 31st May, 2025 and \$60 by 31st August, 2025.
4. Payment of any amount of your choice at a time that suits your circumstances. The Payment Centre on Compass allows you flexibility to make **payments or instalments of your choice at any time**.

You may also make payments with cash or EFTPOS at the school office.

School Savings Bonus funding is not able to be used for voluntary contributions. These funds can be used for uniforms and extra-curricular activities.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities – provided on a user-pays basis

Botanic Ridge Primary School offers a range of optional items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides to deliver the Curriculum. These include excursions and incursions, sports, camps, swimming and other whole school activities.

The cost of extra-curricular items and activities will be advised and charged throughout the year.

Consent and payment for these activities will be requested through Compass as they arise.

Financial Support for Families

Botanic Ridge Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund
- State Schools Relief (SSR)
- Payment plans
- Centrepay, via Centrelink

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
