# Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all students and members of our school community understand:

- (a) our commitment to providing a safe and supportive learning environment for students
- (b) expectations for positive student behaviour
- (c) support available to students and families
- (d) our school's policies and procedures for responding to inappropriate student behaviour.

Botanic Ridge Primary School is committed to providing a safe, secure and stimulating learning environment for all students. We understand that students reach their full potential only when they are happy, healthy and safe, and that a positive school culture, where student participation is encouraged and valued, helps to engage students and support them in their learning. Our school acknowledges that student wellbeing and student learning outcomes are closely linked.

The objective of this policy is to support our school to create and maintain a safe, supportive and inclusive school environment consistent with our school's values.

# **SCOPE**

This policy applies to all school activities, including camps and excursions.

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## **POLICY**

## 1. School profile

Botanic Ridge Primary is a government school with an early childhood setting which opened Term 1 of 2020. There is provision in the Primary School for children from Foundation to Year Six with facilities for a long-term enrolment of 500 children. An integrated Family and Community Centre caters for Four-Year-old Kindergarten and Maternal health is also onsite. The Family and Community Centre is operated by the City of Casey, who are the Department of Education and Training's funding partners in the project.

The facilities have been designed with the following key design principles in mind:

- Buildings that are architecturally designed, visually stimulating, inviting to the community and readily accessible to all
- Landscaping which reflects the surrounding area through the use of native plants

### 2. School values, philosophy and vision

Botanic Ridge Primary School Statement of Values and School Philosophy is integral to the work that we do and is the foundation of our school community. Students, staff, and members of our school community are encouraged to live and demonstrate our core values of Respect, Responsibility, Safety and Growth.

#### VISION

Botanic Ridge Primary School's vision is to inspire and empower all children to learn and achieve through building curiosity and collaboration in a challenging and supportive learning environment that inspires growth. To encourage resilience and a positive self-image, with a focus on respecting ourselves, others, and our world.

#### MISSION

Botanic Ridge Primary School's mission is to; Create a positive climate for learning where we will develop independent learners and problem solvers through explicit teaching and self-directed learning. To lead the development of dynamic relationships through collaboration, high expectations and opportunity for student and community voice and agency in learning. Where we will develop independent learners and problem solvers through explicit instruction and self-directed learning, who design, develop, and assess their learning through opportunities encompassing voice, agency, and leadership. To develop a viable and rich curriculum that is informed by the Strategic plan, promotes shared evidence based pedagogical approaches and is bound by rigorous evaluation embedded in a cycle of inquiry. Where there is a focus on teacher precision, quality, and consistency of practice, while also fostering differentiation based on student needs. To create a climate for learning that supports an appreciation of different cultures and supports children to deepen their understanding of, and respect for, differences through respectful curiosity and their friendships with other children. A learning community where we teach our children about our environment, Australia, and its past, inclusive of our indigenous people. Our children will learn about the importance of behaviours that demonstrate, respect and understanding of all people who inhabit our land and our planet.

## 3. Wellbeing and engagement strategies

Botanic Ridge Primary School has developed a range of strategies to promote engagement, an inclusive and safe environment, positive behaviour, and respectful relationships for all students in our school. We recognise the importance of student friendships and peer support in helping children and students feel safe. We acknowledge that some students may need extra social, emotional or educational support at school, and that the needs of students will change over time as they grow and learn.

A summary of the universal (whole of school), targeted (year group specific) and individual engagement strategies used by our school is included below:

#### Universal

At Botanic Ridge Primary School our universal whole-school practices to support wellbeing and engagement are encompassed by SWPBS, Hour of Power and Real Schools.

School Wide-Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) – An evidence-based approach to improve behaviour, wellbeing and learning. Through this we teach our school values of respect, responsibility, safety and growth.

Hour of Power – With a minimum of 2 sessions per week students will grow might minds, display cultural curiosity, have respectful relationships and use digital diligence: focusing on cross-curricular capabilities of social and emotional learning. Including other frameworks such as safe schools and zones of regulation.

Real Schools – A partnership to foster school culture through key approached of restorative practice and circle time.

Further to this are detailed listed examples of strategies:

- high and consistent expectations for all staff, students and parents and carers
- prioritise positive relationships between staff and students, recognising the fundamental role this plays in building and sustaining student wellbeing
- creating a culture that is inclusive, engaging and supportive
- welcoming all parents/carers and being responsive to them as partners in learning
- analysing and being responsive to a range of school data such as attendance, Attitudes to School Survey, parent survey data, student management data and school level assessment data
- teachers at Botanic Ridge Primary School use the Victorian Teaching and Learning model as basis for our instructional framework to ensure an explicit, common and shared model of instruction to ensure that evidenced-based, high yield teaching practices are incorporated into all lessons
- teachers at Botanic Ridge Primary School adopt a broad range of teaching and assessment approaches to effectively respond to the diverse learning styles, strengths and needs of our students and follow the standards set by the Victorian Institute of Teaching
- our school's Statement of Values are incorporated into our curriculum and promoted to students, staff and parents so that they are shared and celebrated as the foundation of our school community
- carefully planned transition programs to support students moving into different stages of their schooling
- positive behaviour and student achievement is acknowledged in the classroom, and formally in school assemblies and communication to parents
- monitoring of student attendance and implementation of attendance improvement strategies at a wholeschool, cohort and individual level is undertaken
- students have the opportunity to contribute to and provide feedback on decisions about school
  operations through forums such as the Student Representative Council and including year group
  meetings. Students are also encouraged to speak with their teachers, Assistant Principal and Principal
  whenever they have any questions or concerns.
- create opportunities for cross—age connections amongst students through school performances, sporting activities and peer support programs
- All students are welcome to self-refer to the Student Wellbeing Coordinator, Assistant Principal and
  Principal if they would like to discuss a particular issue or feel as though they may need support of any
  kind. We are proud to have an 'open door' policy where students and staff are partners in learning
- programs, incursions and excursions developed to address issue specific behaviors (i.e., Bully Zero program)
- opportunities for student inclusion (i.e., sports teams, clubs, recess and lunchtime activities)

#### Targeted

 Each year Level has a PLC Leader, a senior teacher responsible for their year, who monitor the health and wellbeing of students in their year, and act as a point of contact for students who may need additional support

- Koorie students are supported to engage fully in their education, in a positive learning environment that
  understands and appreciates the strength of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture refer to our
  Aboriginal learning, wellbeing and safety action plan for further information.
- Our English as a second language students are supported through our EAL program, and all cultural and linguistically diverse students are supported to feel safe and included in our school.
- We support learning and wellbeing outcomes of students from refugee background through linking families in with external agencies and supporting students with differentiated learning supports.
- We provide a positive and respectful learning environment for our students who identify as LGBTIQ+ and follow the Department's policy on LGBTIQ Student Support
- All students in Out of Home Care are supported in accordance with the Department's policy on
   <u>Supporting Students in Out-of-Home Care</u> including being appointed a Learning Mentor, having an
   Individual Learning Plan and a Student Support Group (SSG) and being referred to Student Support
   Services for an Educational Needs Assessment
- Students with a disability are supported to be able to engage fully in their learning and school activities in
  accordance with the Department's policy on <u>Students with Disability</u>, such as through reasonable
  adjustments to support access to learning programs, consultation with families and where required,
  student support groups, individual education plans, attendance plans and positive behaviour support
  plans.
- Wellbeing and health staff will undertake health promotion and social skills development in response to needs identified by student wellbeing data, classroom teachers or other school staff each year
- Staff will apply a trauma-informed approach to working with students who have experienced trauma
- Behaviour and attendance tracking through pulse to form solution plans
- Other resources made available such as food bank and state schools relief to support the wellbeing of students and families experiencing hardship
- Other resources such as food bank and state school relief to support families
- Students enrolled under the Department's international student program are supported in accordance with our legal obligations and Department policy and guidelines at: *International Student Program*

#### Individual

Botanic Ridge Primary School implements a range of strategies that support and promote individual engagement.

- Building constructive relationships with students at risk or students who are vulnerable due to complex individual circumstances
- Meeting with student and their parent/carer to talk about how best to help the student engage with school, forming a student support group and inviting external supports if required
- Developing an Individual Learning Plan and/or a Behaviour Support Plan
- Considering if any environmental changes need to be made, for example changing the classroom set-up, or changes too play areas outside the classroom
- Referring the student to:
  - School-based wellbeing supports
  - Student Support Services
  - Appropriate external supports such as council-based youth and family services, other allied health professionals, Headspace, child and adolescent mental health services or Child First
  - Re-engagement programs such as Navigator
  - Kids plus psychology
  - Youth worker

Where necessary the school will support the student's family to engage by:

- being responsive and sensitive to changes in the student's circumstances and health and wellbeing
- collaborating, where appropriate and with the support of the student and their family, with any external allied health professionals, services or agencies that are supporting the student
- monitoring individual student attendance and developing an Attendance Improvement Plans in collaboration with the student and their family
- engaging with our regional Koorie Engagement Support Officers
- running regular Student Support Group meetings for all students:
  - with a disability
  - o in Out of Home Care
  - o with other complex needs that require ongoing support and monitoring.

## 4. Identifying students in need of support

Botanic Ridge Primary School is committed to providing the necessary support to ensure our students are supported intellectually, emotionally and socially. The Wellbeing School Improvement Action Team plays a significant role in developing and implementing strategies to help identify students in need of support and enhance student wellbeing. Botanic Ridge Primary School will utilise the following information and tools to identify students in need of extra emotional, social or educational support:

- personal, health and learning information gathered upon enrolment and while the student is enrolled
- attendance records
- academic performance
- observations by school staff such as changes in engagement, behaviour, self-care, social connectedness and motivation
- attendance, behaviour and suspension data
- engagement with families
- self-referrals or referrals from peers

## 5. Student rights and responsibilities

All members of our school community have a right to experience a safe and supportive school environment. We expect that all students, staff, parents and carers treat each other with respect and dignity. Our school's Statement of Values highlights the rights and responsibilities of members of our community.

Students have the right to:

- participate fully in their education
- feel safe, secure and happy at school
- learn in an environment free from bullying, harassment, violence, racism, discrimination or intimidation
- express their ideas, feelings and concerns.

Students have the responsibility to:

- participate fully in their educational program
- display positive behaviours that demonstrate respect for themselves, their peers, their teachers and members of the school community
- respect the right of others to learn.

Students who may have a complaint or concern about something that has happened at school are encouraged to speak to their parents or carers and approach a trusted teacher or a member of the school leadership team. Further information about raising a complaint or concern is available in our Complaints Policy.

## 6. Student behavioural expectations and management

Behavioural expectations of students are grounded in our school's Statement of Values/Student code of conduct.

Violence, bullying, and other offensive and harmful behaviours such as racism, harassment and discrimination will not be tolerated and will be managed in accordance with this policy. Bullying will be managed in accordance with our Bullying Prevention Policy.

When a student acts in breach of the behaviour standards of our school community, Botanic Ridge Primary School will institute a staged response, consistent with the Department's policies on behaviour, discipline and student wellbeing and engagement. Where appropriate, parents will be informed about the inappropriate behaviour and the disciplinary action taken by teachers and other school staff.

Our school considers, explores and implement positive and non-punitive interventions to support student behaviour before considering disciplinary measures such as suspension, withdrawal of privileges or withdrawal from class.

Disciplinary measures may be used as part of a staged response to inappropriate behaviour in combination with other engagement and support strategies to ensure that factors that may have contributed to the student's behaviour are identified and addressed. Disciplinary measures at our school will be applied fairly and consistently. Students will always be provided with an opportunity to be heard.

Disciplinary measures that may be applied include:

- warning a student that their behaviour is inappropriate
- re-teach expectations to student by referring to positive behaviour matrix
- re-charge in another space (neighbouring or buddy classroom)
- reflect using restorative practices
- teacher controlled consequences or other reasonable and proportionate responses to misbehaviour
- withdrawal of privileges
- referral to the Year Level Coordinator
- behaviour support, intervention meetings and plans
- suspension
- expulsion

Suspension, expulsion and restrictive interventions are measures of last resort and may only be used in situations consistent with Department policy, available at:

In line with Ministerial Order 1125, no student aged 8 or younger will be expelled without the approval of the Secretary of the Department of Education.

The Principal of Botanic Ridge Primary School is responsible for ensuring all suspensions and expulsions are recorded on CASES21.

Corporal punishment is prohibited by law and will not be used in any circumstance at our school.

#### 7. Engaging with families

Botanic Ridge Primary School values the input of parents and carers, and we will strive to support families to engage in their child's learning and build their capacity as active learners. We aim to be partners in learning with parents and carers in our school community.

We work hard to create successful partnerships with parents and carers by:

- ensuring that all parents have access to our school policies and procedures, available on our school website
- maintaining an open, respectful line of communication between parents and staff, supported by our Communicating with School Staff policy.
- providing parent volunteer opportunities so that families can contribute to school activities
- involving families in curriculum-related activities
- involving families in school decision making
- coordinating resources and services from the community for families
- including families in Student Support Groups and developing individual plans for students.

## 8. Evaluation

Botanic Ridge Primary School will collect data each year to understand the frequency and types of wellbeing issues that are experienced by our students so that we can measure the success or otherwise of our school-based strategies and identify emerging trends or needs.

Sources of data that will be assessed on an annual basis include:

- student survey data
- incidents (pulse) data
- school reports
- parent survey
- case management
- CASES21, including attendance and absence data
- SOCS

Botanic Ridge Primary School will also regularly monitor available data dashboards to ensure any wellbeing or engagement issues are acted upon in a timely manner and any intervention occurs as soon as possible.
